New Business:

<u>Resolution 2020-04-01</u> - <u>Motion by McShane, second by Dongvillo to approve the Ballot</u> language for General operating millage to be placed on the August 4, 2020 ballot. Roll call <u>vote – 5 ayes.</u>

Resolution 2020-04-02 - Motion by Dongvillo, second by Deb Lundquist, to approve the ballot language for Ambulance services to be placed on the August 4, 2020 ballot. Roll call vote -5 ayes.

Loan/Bond Process: The township received a letter from the Michigan Department of Treasury regarding the line of credit with Peoples State Bank. The letter states that the loan was contracted outside of the rules set forth by the Treasury, that require municipality loans be bonded. We have contacted our auditor and township counsel for advice as well as Miller Canfield for estimation of costs for the bonding process.

Township Office Electrical: Motion by McShane, second by Shafer, to approve the estimate from Hitching post electric for \$960.00 to make the necessary repairs and upgrades to the electrical panel in the Township Office. 5 ayes.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Bob Hughes commented on the townships previous statement that we would not be asking for an "ambulance" millage since the ambulance service was officially merged with Alger County, rather a "Public safety" or Emergency Services" millage. The board decided to continue to call it an ambulance millage since the all the money raised would be spent on the ambulance portion of the building and loan payments for the new ambulance.
